# **MEPS – Master of Science in Economic Policy**

In the winter semester of 2011/2012, the University of Siegen welcomed the first group of students into the international Master's program of Economic Policy (nicknamed MEPS). Currently, there are 67 students from 28 countries all around the world studying in the MEPS program. This is an enormous success, showing that the MEPS program is an interesting and stimulating Master's program not only for Germans but also for international students.



The MEPS program is structured as any other Master's program with a standard period of studying of four semesters (two years). Within the program come eight compulsory and two elective modules, with the combination of the most important economic topics- for example advanced micro- and macroeconomics, econometrics as well as monetary economics and public policy and governance.

The MEPS program is directed by Prof. Dr. Günter W. Beck, who is not only head of the Chair for European Macroeconomic Studies but also very passionate about the wellbeing and economic education of all students. In accordance with the newly established Academic Advisor system of the University of Siegen, the MEPS students are moreover intensively supervised and mentored by the Academic Advisor of Economics Ms. Kristin Bernhardt.
